In Ontario, Nursing is a profession regulated under the College of Nurses of Ontario. Accountability is one of the seven professional standards for nurses. Once the Fall semester textbooks become available, you will be able to find them on the <u>Campus Store website</u>.

You will find the next four years a special time in your life where you will transition in becoming a valued member of the Nursing profession that provides competent, safe, and ethical care to the public.
